# First Responders Mass

Knights of Columbus, Saints Cosmas & Damian Council 13341 sponsored a First Responders Mass at Our Lady of the Angels Catholic Church on Monday evening, September 9th at 6 PM.

The First Responders Mass is hosted to honor the work of public safety personnel including law enforcement officials, fire-fighters, emergency medical services personnel, and military personnel.

Particularly in the wake of events of September 11th, 2001, the First Responders Mass, also known as the "Blue Mass" is a way to recognize these brave individuals for their sacrifice, and to remember those who have given their lives in service to their communities.

The Knights of Columbus has taken an active role in sponsoring Masses in the communities in which it serves, to join with the community in expressing appreciation to these dedicated professionals for all their selfless work.

This special Mass honors those who sacrificed their lives on Sept 11, 2001, at the World Trade Center trying to selflessly help others. It also honors those who continue to put their lives on the line by responding to emergencies in our community.

Father William Sanderson presided over the Mass with Deacon John Schaefer assisting. Past Grand Knight John Joly was the Reader and Grand Knight Gordon Shellhaas was the Sacristan.

In his sermon, Father Sanderson used the feast day of Saint Peter Claver as an example of An early Christian "First Responder". Father Claver was a Jesuit priest born in Spain who left the comforts of home and traveled to Cartagena, Columbia in the early 17<sup>th</sup> Century (1600-1650). He devoted himself to easing the suffering of African people who were transported to Columbia under the most horrible conditions and sold as slaves.


